## COVID-19 Booster Dose for Moderately or Severely Immunocompromised People

**Updated October 25, 2021** 

## Moderately or severely immunocompromised people:

- Who have received two doses of an mRNA vaccine (Pfizer-BioNTech, Moderna)
  - **Should** receive an **additional mRNA dose** (Pfizer-BioNTech, Moderna) immediately after **28 days** since the **second** dose.
  - May receive a single COVID-19 booster dose (Pfizer-BioNTech, Moderna, or Janssen) at least 6 months after their third mRNA vaccine dose.
- $\triangle$  In such situations, those people may receive a total of **FOUR** COVID-19 vaccine doses.
- Who are age 18 years or older and received a single dose Janssen COVID-19 vaccine
  - Should receive a single COVID-19 booster vaccine (Pfizer-BioNTech, Moderna, or Janssen) at least 2 months.
- $\triangle$  A person who received one primary dose of the Janssen COVID-19 vaccine should **not** receive **more than two** COVID-19 vaccine doses.

## Who is considered moderately or severely immunocompromised?

Moderately or severely immunocompromised people include those who have:

- Been receiving active cancer treatment for tumors or cancers of the blood.
- Received an organ transplant and are taking medicine to suppress the immune system.
- Received a **stem cell transplant** within the last 2 years or are taking medicine to suppress the immune system.
- Moderate or severe primary **immunodeficiency** (such as DiGeorge syndrome, Wiskott-Aldrich syndrome).
- Advanced or untreated **HIV infection**.
- Active treatment with high-dose corticosteroids or other drugs that may suppress your immune response.
